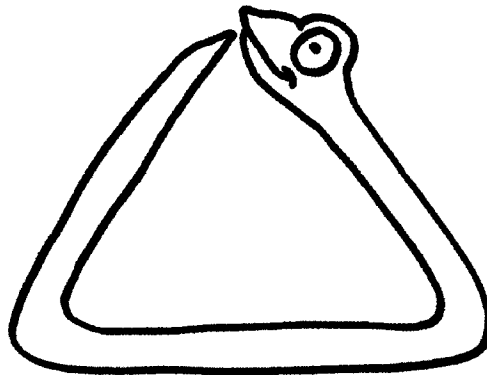
The Silly slithery shape snake!

triangle, square, and circle.

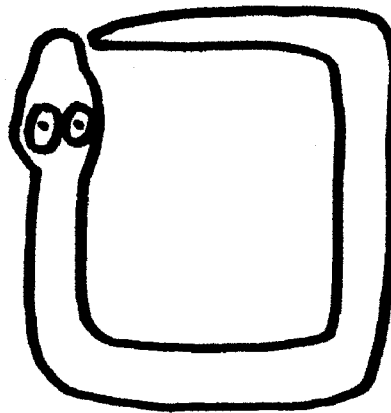

Can you find Red, Yellow, Blue, Purple, Green, and Orange?

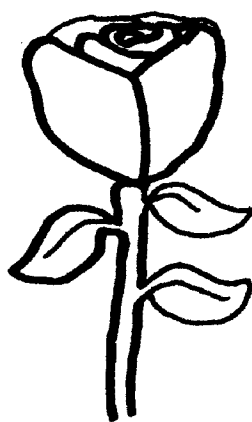
Can you find triangles, squares, circles, ovals? Draw what you discover here!



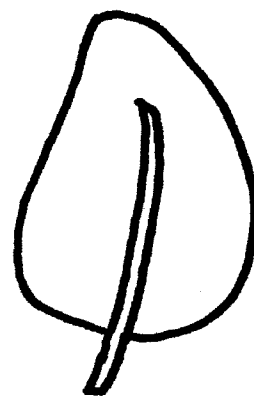
Jungle Photo Adventure



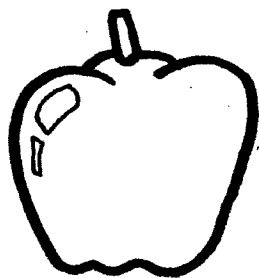

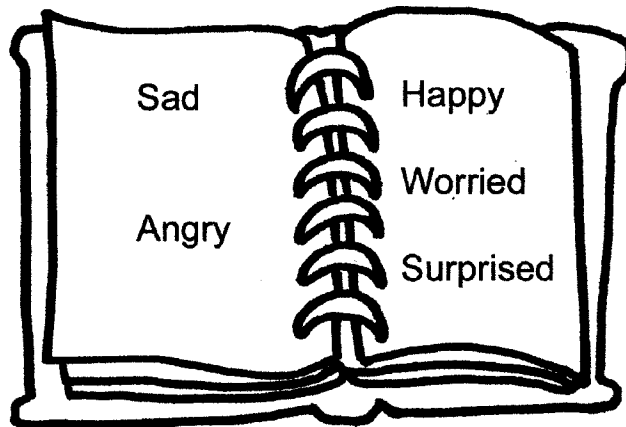
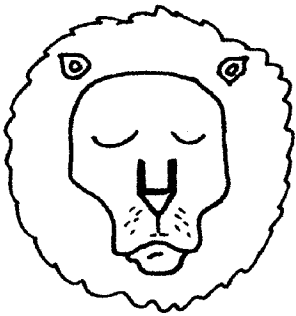
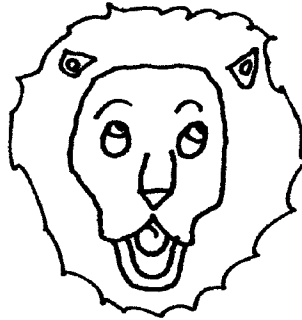
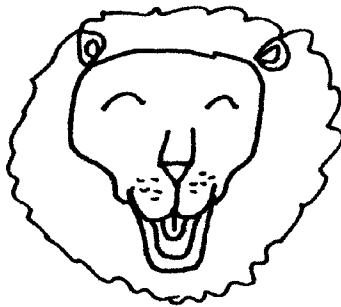
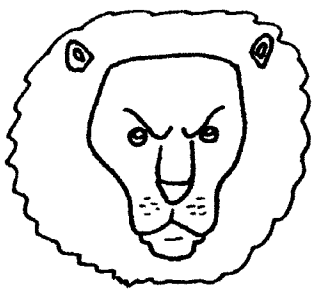
Jungle Drawing Fun!

There is a party in the jungle and you're invited! The big elephant says it's time to draw! Can you draw a picture of yourself exploring the jungle?



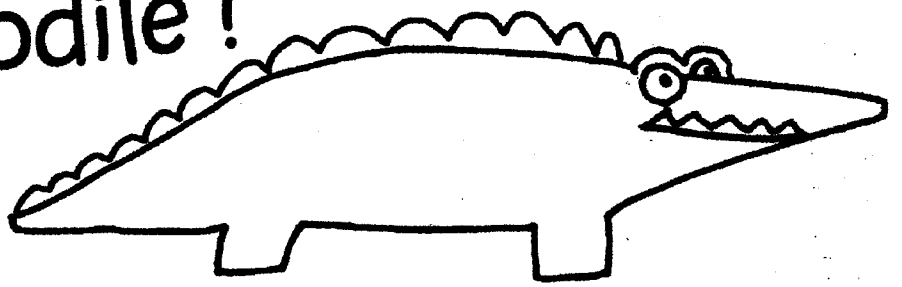
Look at Lion!

Zig-Zag Line



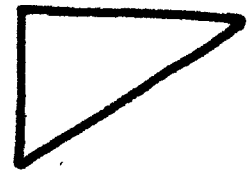
Circle and half-circle



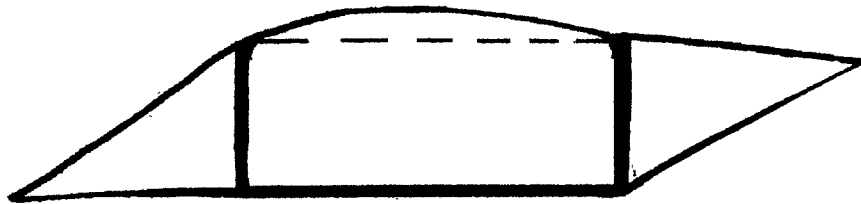
Triangle



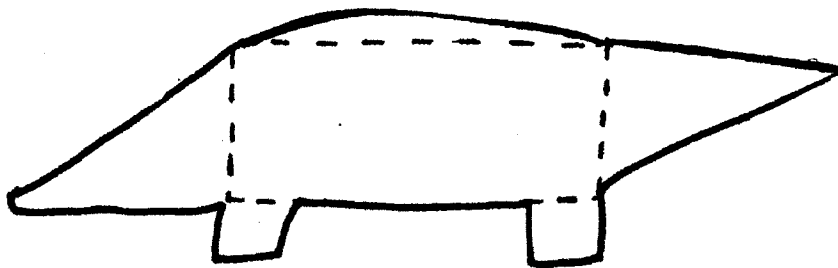
Rectangle, with hump



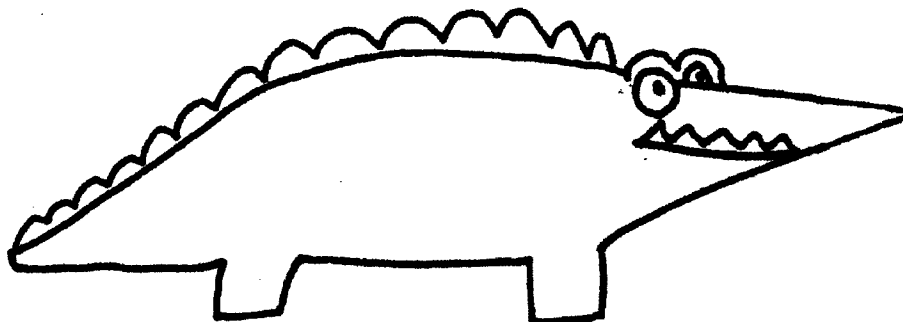

Connect the pieces together. You can erase the top line of the rectangle and leave the hump.



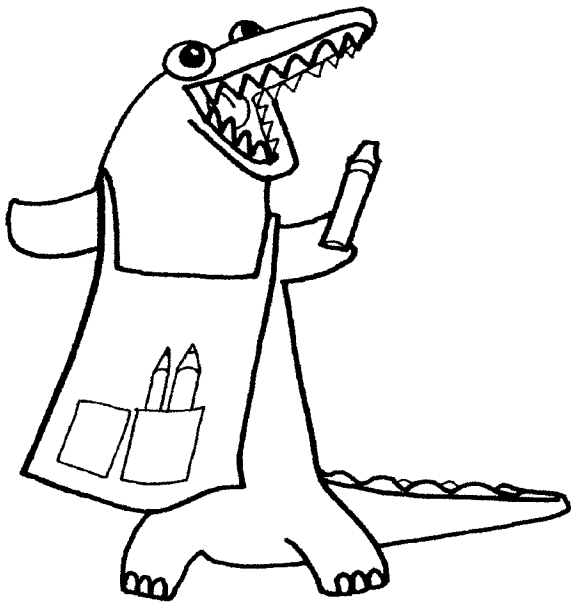
Draw two squares at the base of the rectangle. These will be the legs. Now you can erase the inside lines



Now draw a zig-zag line on top of the triangle and rectangle. Include the circle and half-circle as eyes. Draw another zig-zag line as the mouth.

Wow! You're done!



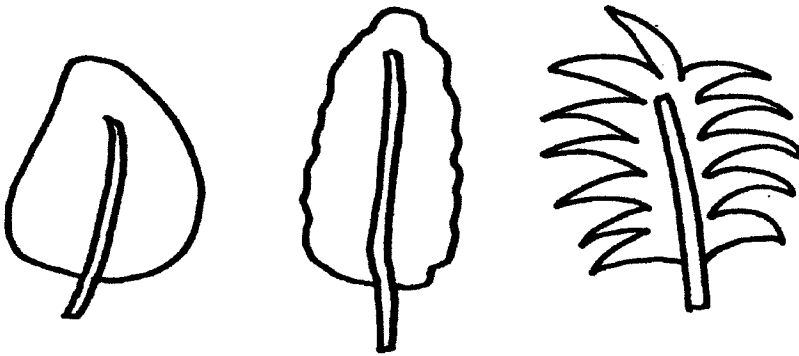
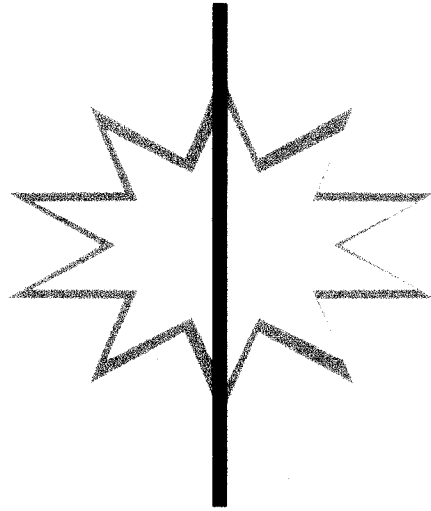
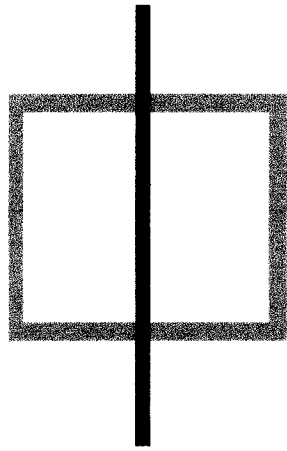

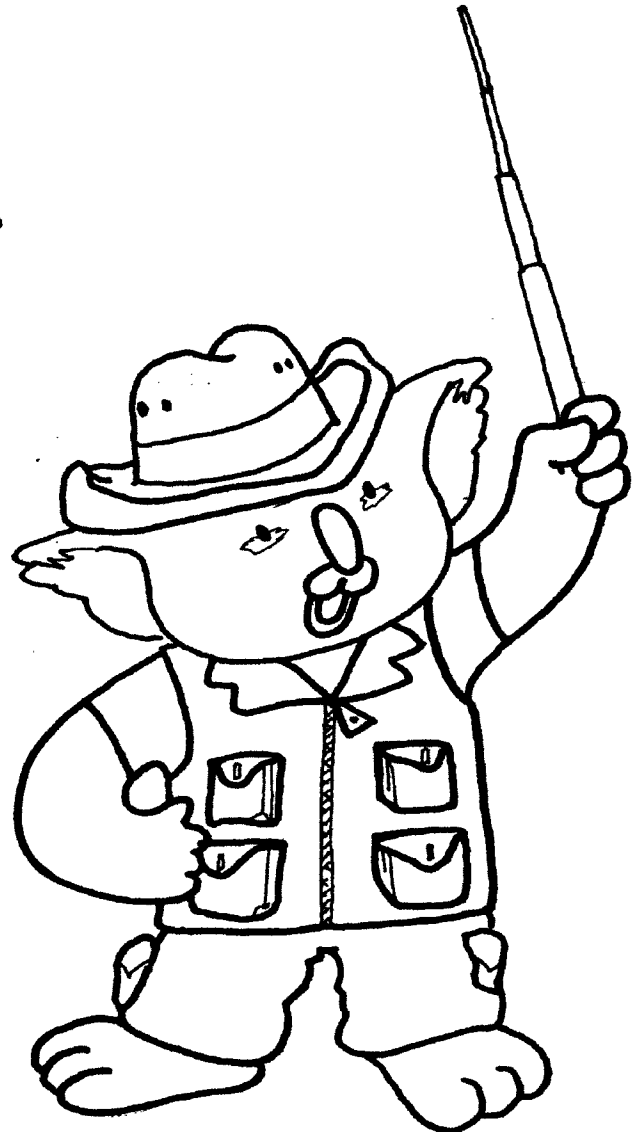


Composition 101: Symmetry



Symmetry is when the sides of a figure reflect each other. In the square and starburst figures above, look at how each side of the dark black line can fold onto the other half and match.

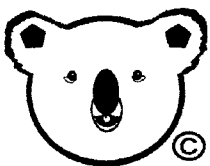
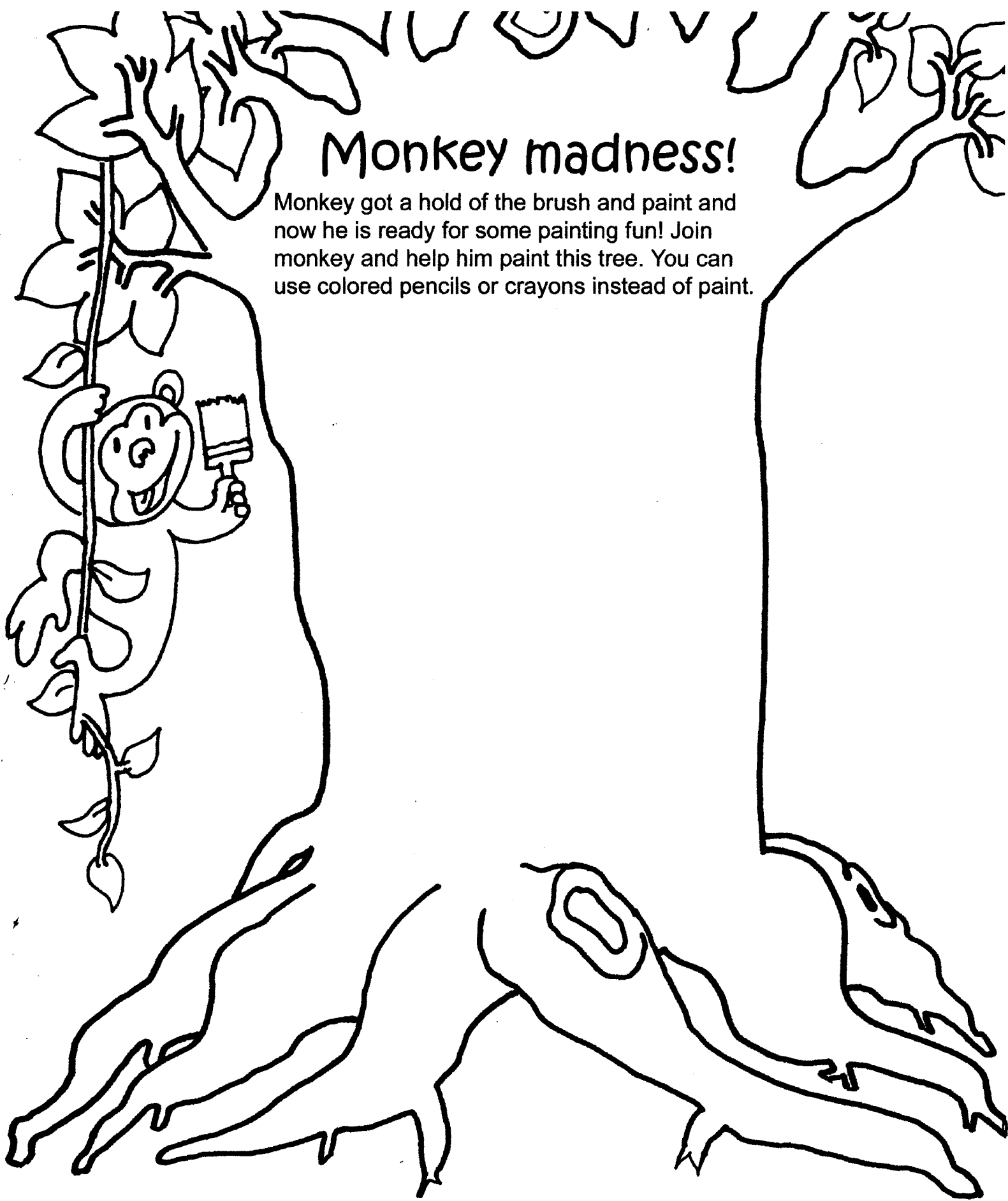

Monkey madness!

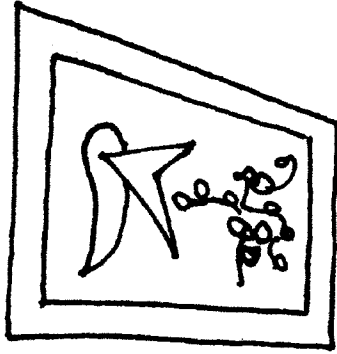
